Family-centred support

The Early Intervention Service provides personalised support in the home or early childhood setting for:

- » deaf/hard of hearing babies and children birth to school age
- » hearing children of deaf adults (CODA)
- » families, carers and early childhood personnel.

We work with families to develop a personalised program. The team is made up of qualified teachers of the deaf and a speech pathologist.

Programs may focus on:

- » listening skills
- » spoken language
- » speech development
- » sign language (AUSLAN).

- » in-home and early childhood setting visits
- » professional learning for centres
- » playgroups
- » advice and support
- » support with audiological equipment
- » acoustic assessments
- » transition to school support
- » resources to support learning programs
